Stories must not have been published before, or submitted for publication or entered into another competition before the Cambridge Autumn Festival Short Story Competition winners are announced on 27 March 2025. Please do not include your name on the manuscript itself.

 3. Stories are to be fiction and maximum 1500 words. All manuscripts are to have double-line spacing.

 4. An entrant can submit more than one story but each story must be supplied individually with a completed entry form. The stories must be submitted by the author. Entries are to be received no later than 5.00pm Monday 3 February 2025.
